Wright Brothers Pinnacles Hiking Trail

City of Moraine Development of Historic Pinnacles site:

The City of Moraine held a ribbon cutting ceremony on Saturday, September 21st to open the new 1.1-mile Wright Brothers Pinnacles Historical Hiking Trail. The Pinnacles is a ridge and cliff overlooking the Miami River and is the site in the late 1890's where the Wright Brothers



would watch the flight of large birds on the cliff updrafts. Wilbur Wright obtained his wing warping or roll theory for his future heavier than air airplane wings by watching the birds here. Many photos taken by the Wright Brothers at the Pinnacles are also reproduced on signs. Sketches of trees and wildflowers drawn by Orville Wright and poet Paul Lawrence Dunbar while hiking the Pinnacles with their high school botany class adorn another sign. Other historical signs from the 1890's are installed along the trail.

The ceremony was hosted by Moraine Parks & Recreation Director Brent Shane. Mayor Teri Murphy stated that the new hiking trail joins several other Wright Brothers related sites in Moraine such as the Dayton Wright Airplane Company



that in 1917 developed and built America's first bomber—the DeHavilland DH-4: and the Wright Seaplane Base, one of the world's first seaplane bases where Orville Wright conducted over 100 flights between 1912 and 1914. City Councilman Dave Miller spoke on the Wright Brothers historical presence at the Pinnacles, of fossils found along the trail and of a Native American mound and artifacts found at the Pinnacles in 1968.

Brent Shane thanked Mr. Miller for his hard work on the trail as well as other clubs, organizations, volunteers and

city staff who contributed in some way to either the maintenance and development of the trail, creating or installing the signage, doing historical research or proving the funding.

The hiking trail has two trailhead entrances. The South Trailhead is off of the Main Street Bike Trail about .4 miles from Wax Park. The North Trailhead is off of the Pinnacle Road Bike Trail, .4 miles from Deer Meadow Park. "People can enjoy the outdoor recreation benefits of this new hiking trail, stated Miller. Constructed in three major components between 1816–1850, this legendary home raised three generations of Pattersons, including legendary industrialist John H. Patterson who founded his National Cash Register enterprise on the family's land—roughly a half-mile northwest of Patterson Homestead.

Originally the home of Revolutionary War soldier and Lexington, Kentucky, and Cincinnati, Ohio, founder, Colonel Robert Patterson, this Federal-style historic house museum tells the story of Dayton's influential Patterson family. Colonel Patterson first settled here in 1804, and upon his death in 1827, Rubicon Farm (the name of his land) covered 2,038 acres.

In 1953, John H. Patterson's nephew Jefferson Patterson donated Patterson Homestead to the City of Dayton—its six period rooms showcased 18th and 19th century antiques and Patterson family artifacts. Over time, more family-related artifacts have been added to the collection, and an exhibit gallery was included to tell NCR's groundbreaking story.

Wright Brothers Aeroboat Replica

City of Moraine Commemoration of the Wright Seaplane Base

City of Moraine Press Release:

The City of Moraine completed the final pieces of a mini-park area across from 3315 Main Street in Moraine that contains a 1/4 replica of the Wright Model G Aeroboat soaring atop a flagpole. Through funding by the Wright Seaplane Base Inc. Organization and the City of Moraine, historical signage, park benches and a concrete pad was installed by the Moraine Street Division and the Moraine Building Maintenance Department. An additional appreciation plaque is mounted on a large rock donated by Stony Hollow Landfill. The signage tells the story of the Model G and of Orville Wright's over 100 aeroboat flights between 1912 and 1914 along the Miami River in Moraine and West Carrollton.



Notes:

- This new mini-park does NOT replace the seaplane site or the marker down along the river. There is still a Wright Seaplane Base State of Ohio Historical Marker at the Miami & Erie Canal Park in West Carrolton along the Miami River with the original seaplane base site just across the river from the historical marker. It is just off I-75, exit 47.
- Parking for the new Model G replica mini-park is not available on Main Street but there are two parking options. Parking Option #1, people can park along Elter Drive since the mini-park is basically at the corner of Elter Drive and Main Street. Parking Option #2, people can park at the First Freedom Baptist Church parking lot at 3315 Main Street and walk across Main Street to the mini-park.
- FYI If you leave the mini-park and walk 50 yards along the Main Street sidewalk (on the north side of Main Street) up onto the Main Street Bridge (which flows over the Miami River), we have a City of Moraine Historical Marker recognizing the Wright Seaplane Base along the northwest sidewalk/entrance to the bridge (see the photo in the lower right corner below).

The overall exhibition contains a multitude of aviation and space-themed displays made from tens of thousands of vibrant LED bulbs, with prominent works including a twenty-foot-tall Saturn V rocket and a giant Apollo-era astronaut saluting the

The Display officially kicks-on at 7:00 p.m. on Friday, November 29th, when the lights are turned on for the first time during the "Grand Illumination" event. The museum itself will be open as part of the event for guests to shop or visit from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm.



The lights will be on for guests to enjoy from dusk until dawn every night until the end of the year. Holiday lights will be spread periodically throughout the museum grounds to allow guests to social distance if they so choose.

The light display will once again be part of the Ohio Holiday Lights Trail, a compilation of the state's most impressive light displays curated by Ohio. Find It Here., the state's tourism division. This year's holiday

lights trail features dozens of amazing locations and attractions across the Buckeye State.
