Wright Flyer III Closer to State Plane Designation

DAYTON, OHIO -- With the passage of Senate Bill 24, the Wright Flyer III, housed in Carillon Historical Park's John W. Berry Sr. Wright Brothers National Museum, takes one step closer to being designated the Ohio state plane.



The bill, passed on February 12, 2025, is backed by Terry Johnson (R-McDermott) and Stephen A. Huffman (R-Tipp City).

The 1905 Wright Flyer III, built, tested, and extensively flown in Ohio, is the world's first practical airplane, capable of sustained and fully maneuverable flights. As they progressed, the Wright brothers developed a useful, marketable invention that changed the world.

In 1990, the 1905 Wright Flyer III became the first airplane designated a National Historic Landmark by the United States Department of the Interior. The U.S. Mint featured the plane on the Ohio quarter in 2002, and the American Society of Mechanical Engineers designated the plane a Historic Mechanical Engineering Landmark in 2003.

Regarding the bill, Brady Kress, President and CEO of Dayton History, stated, "As the owner and caretaker of this national treasure, Carillon Park is proud to exhibit the 1905 Wright Flyer III, and the designation as Ohio's official state plane would be a genuine honor".

With SB's 24 passing, it will now move on to the Ohio House of Representatives for approval and, if passed, onto Governor Mike DeWine's desk.

Fly Higher With Kites March 11 & 12 2:15 pm - 3:15 pm at Tri-State Warbirds



Head of Special Collections & Archives

We're pleased to announce Toni Vanden Bos has been appointed Head of Special Collections and Archives. Toni holds a Master of Arts in Library and Information Studies with an Archives Specialization from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a B.A. in History with Geography minor from Gustavus Adolphus College. Her career started at the Wisconsin Historical Society as a public records archivist, and then transitioned to academic archives working for the University of Texas-San Antonio as a processing archivist and later assistant archivist. Toni has been a member of the University Libraries staff since February



2003 when she joined our team as an archivist just in time to experience the centennial anniversary of powered flight in the city recognized globally as the birthplace of aviation. Since then, Toni has managed media requests, outreach, preservation, and cataloging for the department; been a catalyst for starting the born-digital records preservation program, and implementation of the content management system ArchivesSpace; and secured grant funding for enhanced preservation and access to the collections. She has represented Special Collections and Archives and Wright State University at numerous events, presentations, and exhibits on campus and in the community.

Most recently she has served as the interim assistant head of Special Collections and Archives from June 2024 - October 2024. Toni manages the talented and dedicated Special Collections and Archives staff, and oversees the day-to-day operation of Special Collections and Archives in preserving and providing access to significant historical collections documenting the history of Dayton and the Miami Valley, the Wright brothers and early aviation in the Miami Valley, and Wright State University's history. Toni is also responsible for overseeing digitization projects and Wright State's institutional repository, CORE Scholar. The archival collections are a wealth of information for research and a source of inspiration and pride for our campus and community. We invite you to visit the Reading Room on the fourth floor of the Dunbar Library anytime the doors are open during the department's open hours. Everyone is welcome to view exhibits on the Wright Brothers and other archival collections, as well as browse the reading room book and journal collection. Researchers and visitors can also make an appointment ahead of a visit to meet with an archivist for help with accessing collections and starting research.
