Kidz Zone – Engineer Week at Tri-State Warbirds February 22, 2025 @ 11:00 am - 12:30 pm




Join us in celebrating National Engineers Week! Explore the Museum, build some crafts, and discover the basics of engineering.

Champaign Aviation Museum Free Lecture

Thursday, February 20th, 2025 at 11:00am

The Spanish-American War

Presented by Robert Mergel, P.E., P.S. (Ret.) and Major Edward Sachs, USAF Reserve



This presentation explores the Causes, Nations, Leadership, Preparedness, Weaponry, Major Engagements, and Conclusion of the Spanish American War. Professor Emeritus Robert Mergel and Major Edward Sachs portray Lt. Colonel Theodore Roosevelt and Colonel Leonard Wood of the 1st US Volunteer Cavalry in period uniform.

The presentation includes an MS PowerPoint media depiction of the Administration of Spain and the United States prior to hostilities, the sinking of the US Battleship Maine, preparedness and mobilization of the warring nations, the army and naval commanders and forces, and a description of the major engagements and the terms of the Peace Agreement. Interspersed with the MS PowerPoint presentation is a display of the weaponry and accoutrements of the combatants. This presentation held during the week of President's Day is significant, as it was the Spanish American War that ultimately propelled Roosevelt into the White House.

About our Speaker:

In 2012 Robert (Bob) Mergel retired from Columbus State Community College, Columbus, Obio and was awarded the title of Professor Emeritus. Upon retirement be held the position as professor and coordinator of Civil Engineering Technology. In 2018 he retired as a senior lecturer at the Obio State University College of Engineering teaching undergraduate civil



engineering and surveying courses. In 2019 Bob retired his registration as a Professional Surveyor and a Professional Engineer in the State of Ohio. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from the Ohio State University (1972), Master of Education Degree from the Ohio University (1990) and a Master of Science Degree in Geodetic Science and Surveying from the Ohio State University (2002).

Parachute Museum Theater

One Day with the Golden Knights Style & Accuracy Team


14 in a series of videos featured on the Aviation Trail Parachute Museum Theater



In preparation for the 2010 Nationals, the Golden Knights Style and Accuracy Team trains in classic accuracy at Laurinburg, North Carolina. Classic or precision accuracy is a parachuting discipline in which a competitor makes their first point of contact with their heel on a electronic scoring pad in the center of a tuffet. The scoring pad is typically black with a one centimeter yellow dot in the center. The pad is thirty two centimeters across or roughly the size of a medium pizza. The competitors are scored in centimeters. If the jumpers hits the exact center, they receive a zero for the round. The further to the edge the contact is made, the higher the centimeters, all the way to sixteen. At the end of a ten round or ten jump meet, the competitor with the lowest score is the winner. In this video, you see only three jumps of a ten to fifteen jump day. Special thanks to the pilots and competitors. Video shot by SSG Chris Acevedo, compiled by SSG Laura Dickmeyer.
